Singing the Lord's Song in a Strange Land

2022 CENTRAL/SOUTHERN
 ILLINOIS SYNOD ASSEMBLY

The 2022 Central/Southern Illinois Synod Assembly was held both online and in-person with a Zoom session on March 26 and together on June 2-4 in Champaign. The theme for this year's assembly was "Singing the Lord's Song in a Strange Land," encouraging us to think about how we do ministry in 2022 and beyond amidst the changes in the world around us.

It was great to be back together after last year's Zoom-only assembly due to COVID-19.

While the annual Synod Assembly is an important gathering to conduct the business before it, it is more than a legislative session. It is part of our call for spiritual discernment for the pastors and congregations to get together to explore where the Holy Spirit might be calling us.

"We are here – in this moment, in this time – to tend to Christ's Church; that is, to tend to the gift that God has given us to be God's own and come together to steward the grace entrusted to us."

The assembly heard from three ecumenical presenters — Elissa Bailey (Stated Clerk, Presbytery of Great Rivers of the Presbyterian Church), Edward Braxton (Bishop Emeritus, Diocese of Belleville of the Catholic Church), and Frank Beard (Bishop, Illinois Great Rivers Conference of the United Methodist Church) on the theme of “Singing the Lord’s Song in a Strange Land,” how they are experiencing the new reality the church finds itself in, and where God is in all this.



The assembly took part in an creation of a tree on the wall of our meeting room. In devotions, at worship, and in forums, people were asked to write prayers, laments, and hopes on paper shaped to resemble the bark, leaves, drops of water, and butterflies. These reflections and responses engaged our ongoing discernment as a synod.

Our festival worship service on Thursday evening took an offering for our companion synods of the Malagasy Lutheran Church. More than \$8,200 will be sent to support the Lutheran church in Madagascar! The service was livestreamed on the C/SIS YouTube channel, and the recording is available to watch any time.

Actions taken:

- Approved the minutes of the 2021 Synod Assembly
- Elected synod council members: Austin Byer, Eileen Setti
- Elected synod council secretary: Pastor Christine McNeal
- Elected members of the Consultation Committee: Jason Helmers, Pastor Joy Miller, and Mark Scherer

The Assembly also heard the synod council’s recommendation to continue the sister–congregation ministry, and that congregations consider dwelling in the Word practices with their sister congregation over the next year.
