Synod Mission Support and Stewardship Education Representative – 3- year term, Pastor Youngshim Pitcher.



We mourned the death of retired pastors Rev. Gerald Kissel & Ruth Kissel and Rev. Ray Heilener.

The 2022 Fall Assembly was a wonderful International Mission Fair, September 25 at Our Redeemer, Marion. There were booths with speakers from many different nations, indigenous materials, music, dance, food and international worship. Rev. Wayne Shelksohn and Bishop Roth shared about our companion synods in Madagascar and the Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM).

Spring Southern Conference Assembly will be Sunday March 26 at Salem Jonesboro.

We rejoice with Marion Medical Mission that they were able to install 3,855 protected water wells in Malawi, Tanzania, Zambia, and for the first time, in Mozambique. Those wells serve an estimated 382,000 people (229,200 children). Since 1990, MMM has installed just under 50,000 wells serving over 5 million people. As it says in the cement on the top of every well: "Glory be to God!"

The West Central Conference is comprised of twenty-seven congregations running from Springfield on the north end of the conference down to the congregations of the Metro East St. Louis area on the south, with congregations flanking both the east and west sides of the I-55 corridor. In addition, we have rostered leaders serving in specialized ministry at Meridian Village in Glen Carbon, a ministry of Lutheran Senior Services; the Taylorville Correctional Center; and, HSHS Hospice of Southern Illinois.

In October, we met for our fall gathering at Meridian Village in Glen Carbon. Meridian Village is a senior living community operated by Lutheran Senior Services. Pastor Gerhard Kraus, a pastor in our conference, serves as the chaplain at Meridian. The gathering included meaningful worship led by Pastor Kraus; an online presentation by tech guru, author, and Lutheran pastor Ryan Panzer on the topic of the role of technology in ministry in light of the COVID pandemic; and, a tour of Meridian Village.

In December, we gathered at Faith Lutheran Church in Jacksonville for our annual Bishop's Colloquy. The gathering included worship, conversation with Bishop Roth, and lunch. The gathering ended with a visit to the largest Advent calendar in the state of Illinois!

On January 6, we resumed our annual Epiphany Gathering at the home of Pastors Stefan and Cynthia Munker in Litchfield. Great food, great fellowship, and great Gluhwein were enjoyed by all. We concluded the gathering by sharing in Holden Evening Prayer.

In February, we gathered on Shrove Tuesday at St. Paul's Lutheran in Hillsboro for our Conference Assembly. Following a delicious pancake and sausage supper, voting members and guests shared together in worship, followed by a guided conversation around the eight

threads emerging from the 2022 Synod Assembly. It was a hope-filled conversation. In the business portion of the assembly, the conference voted to give a gift of \$3600 with \$1200 going to each of the following recipients: Lutheran Disaster Response for Middle East Earthquake Relief, Lutheran Social Services of Illinois, and the Bible Schools of our companion synods in Madagascar.

We are looking forward to our spring gathering that will take place in May at St. John's Lutheran in Springfield at which Bishop Yehiel Curry of the Metro Chicago Synod will lead us in a presentation on the topic "Preaching the Spirit with an Eye toward Pentecost." And, as usual, we look forward to enjoying some sort of social gathering as a conference at the upcoming synod assembly in June.
